



Individual Volunteer Opportunities

Resettlement

Apartment Set-ups

- Help set up a new arrival's apartment by loading, unloading and setting up furniture. Prepare a welcoming home for newly arrived refugees.

Grocery Shopping

- Shop for culturally appropriate foods for newly arriving families. Stock pantries and refrigerators.

Basic Needs/Clothing Closet

- Sort donations, put them into their proper places in the closets. (Mon., Tues., Fri., 9-5)
- Help client's while they select clothing.

Youth and Education

Elementary School Tutoring

- Offer support in our after school programs. Participate in educational and recreational activities. (Mon-Thurs 2:30-5:30)

Middle School Tutoring

- Help students with homework and participate in educational and recreational activities. (Mon-Fri 4:00-6:30 pm)

Summer camp

- Participate in recreational activities. Build relationships and mentor our youth. (June and/or July)

Adult Education

English at Home

- Be matched with an individual or family to meet in the clients home and offer English learning support. (3 month commitment)

Civic Engagement

- Encourage New American citizens to register to vote. partake in "get out the vote", canvassing, and helping clients check their registration status.

Mentors for Vocational Counseling

- Engage in a professional mentorship with a client in their chosen career field. Provide vocational coaching to help clients reach their desired career goals.

Departmental Support

Administrative Support

- Assist staff with filing and clerical work. Position provides understanding on the resettlement process and the chance to interact with staff.

Transportation

- Provide transportation for our clients to doctor and WIC appointments, classes, or job interviews. (Mon-Thurs as needed)
