Afterschool Program Elementary and Middle School Tutoring

Virtually Volunteer with our Bright Futures Afterschool program. Help refugee elementary and middle school youth develop their English skills, provide homework assistance, participate in educational, extra-curricular and recreational activities, or lead a lesson/activity.

We have opportunities during the school year at three schools in Clarkston and Stone Mountain.

- Elementary School, Monday through Thursday from 2:30–5:30 p.m.
- Middle School, Monday through Thursday from 4:00–6:30 p.m.

Vocational Counseling/Mentor

Mentors work with clients to help them identify their career goals, provide vocational coaching, develop job readiness, and help advance professional opportunities in their desired field. All professional experience is welcome. Opportunities exist year-round.

English at Home

We offer opportunities to work one-on-one with refugee families and individuals to help them develop their English language skills. Volunteers serve at least two hours a week with their learners via video call. Opportunities exist year-round but require a minimum three-month commitment.
